Hurry Spring!

Cold outside you say? Who cares said Dave Reidel and I ... And why should I put on heavier clothes ... just because it was close to 20-degrees Fahrenheit at 1500 feet...more clothes meant less space and Riedel is so much bigger than me anyway...but we proved we weren't only warm weather flyers...no sir, not us! That was a couple of weeks ago and we did manage to have a nice flight with the little heater just taking the edge off the cold. But I haven't been back up there since...isn't winter flying great!

Today the special weather brief in from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management warned of sub-zero degree wind chill, snow and windy conditions ... it said don't forget to wear a hat as the head is a major source of the body's heat loss. Hurry Spring!

Plagued by one cancelled flight after another, my students and I are hardly flying at all. I think this is very different than last year. But we all know that it won't be long before we are once again complaining about how miserably hot and humid it is in our hangars.

Guess we need to be using this time for planning activities instead doing them. No time like the present to plan the warm spring and summer events we look forward to so much.

A major change this year will be the location for the club fly-ins. Boots Lenn has informed us that we may not hold our club fly-ins at the farm this year. It has to do with the lease agreement between the Lenn Brothers and the people that lease the land for farming. We are still allowed to fly to the field and practice our landing skills but no picnicking at the farm as before. I am trying to nail down some of the rules for events that will be identified by Club 4 as those that will be conducted at the Father's Day Fly In at Footlight Ranch this year. I know our club flyers do not really need the training but we can use it as another excuse to get together for a hot dog or something.

By the way, I have told all the clubs in the region, in no uncertain terms, that Club 1 will score highest in all events at footlight this year. I think the other clubs know this and probably won't even show up for the competition. They don't call us Club 1 for nuthin...Right?

I am looking forward to Footlight as well as other events this year. One big deal for me promises to be the run down to Kitty Hawk. Mike Moulds is passing around a draft of a flight plan...anyone that wants to fly down with the gaggle and land near Kill devil Hill should let Mike know. Advisories

January Club Meeting – Our January meeting was held on the Saturday after our normal meeting schedule because it was so close to the New Year holiday. The meeting was held on Saturday, January 4, in the Club House at Warrenton Air Park, following a Club Board of Directors' meeting.

Phil Williams reported that he and Jim Willess were removing the skins from his plane to replace them with new red, white and blue covers. "Salute when you see it!" he instructed.

Mike Moulds, our Treasurer, reported that we have \$3,265.50 in the bank at the end of the 2002 year. Our income was \$1927.00 and our expenses were \$2330.39, resulting in a loss of \$381.14. Mike attributed the loss to flyin expenses so, as Mike put it, we had fun while we lost it

Members were reminded that 2003 membership dues were due. Several present re-upped during the meeting.

Lew reminded everyone that the USUA Annual Meeting is coming up in Frederick on the 22nd of February. This is the first time since the very first Annual Meeting that one has been held nearby. This is everyone's best chance to attend an Annual Meeting. Details (schedule and location) will be published as soon as they are known.

Lew went on to mention the Virginia Ultralight Safety Seminar which will be held at the Museum at the airport in Richmond on March 15. Attending it is well worth your time. Members driving down will have empty seats for those needing rides.

Our first flyin is not scheduled until May 31, our Memorial Flyin. It was scheduled to be held at the Lenn Brothers Field. However, during the meeting, Dick Walker told us of a rumor he had picked up that the Lenn Brothers field was no longer open for our flyins. The Club had not heard anything about that. Rich said he would check it out and did. The rumor was confirmed by Boots. Due to lease agreements they have made, we have been asked not to hold future flyins at their field. They will, however, permit us to do flight training there, so all is not lost. We all will remember our last two years of flyins at their field and their wonderful hospitality.

Lew told us about AOPA's Airport Watch Program, a kind of airport neighborhood watch program. He suggested that we should all get involved in it as a way of helping protect the reputation of aviation from the many criticisms about light aircraft being a security risk. He outlined what AOPA says we should be on the lookout for:

- Pilots who appear to be under the control of someone else.
- Anyone trying to access an aircraft through force – without keys, using a screwdriver or crowbar.
- Anyone who seems unfamiliar with aviation procedures trying to check out an airplane.
- Anyone who misuses aviation lingo or seems too eager to us all the lingo.
- People or groups who seem determined to keep to themselves.
- Any members of your airport neighborhood who work to avoid contact with you or other airport tenants.
- Anyone who appears to be just loitering, with no specific reason for being there.
- Any out-of-the-ordinary videotaping of aircraft or hangars.
- Aircraft with unusual or obviously unauthorized modifications.
- Danger our cargo or loads explosives, chemicals, openly displayed weapons – being loaded into an airplane.
- Anything that strikes you as wrong listen to your gut instinct, and then follow through.

When in doubt, check it out! Check with the airport staff, call the National Response Center (1-866-GA-SECURE) or call 911. Airports such as those we fly out of don't have much security. We must help be their security.

Dave Riedel, our new Vice President, was introduced as our Events Coordinator, at least for the first flyin of the year. (Maybe we can talk him into continuing in the position after that if we all pitch in and help him.)

Phil Williams told us that the CDs of the Rotax Tabernacle Choir at our Holiday Party are ready but the covers are not. He will most likely have them at our February meeting.

Mr. Beatley raised objections about our having placed the metal cabinet for our library in the Club House. We assured him that the cabinet would be removed from the Club House and placed down in Larry Walker's hangar. Mr. Beatley indicated that he plans

to increase his personal use of the Club House building which will reduce our use of it. Larry intends to talk with him about the problem.

Rich told the members about the Board's tasking to come up with ideas about how to make the meetings more interesting. He asked the members also to contribute their ideas at the next meeting.

Mike Moulds moved to establish a fund to purchase a rescue trailer and a Club flyin trailer. No Club funds would be put into the fund; it will only accept donations.

The motion was approved. Before the meeting was over, Mike, Larry and Jim Willess each had contributed \$100 to the fund.

Jim Heidish has created a beautiful aviation anniversary 2003 calendar that he has made available to Club members. If you are a current 2003 member, you may have one for a \$3 contribution to the Club, \$5 for non-2003 members.

Chuck Tippett and John King offered this evening's program – a visual report on their summer flight to Alaska and back. Great photographs of an amazing flying odyssey.

Reminder: the February meeting will be back at our regular meeting place, the Centreville Elementary School, at 7:30 PM on February 6, 2003.
