I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Club for your vote of confidence by electing me president for the next two years. Like promotions in the military, it is not so much on how well I've done in the past, but my potential for properly filling the position and leading the Club forward from here. I know that I have huge shoes to fill, but I will do my best to make my old mentor and president proud. I will talk about where I see the Club heading and future challenges in following newsletters.

What I did want to talk about in this newsletter is volunteerism. Our Club, like any other club, is run and functions on the strength of the volunteers in the Club. The officers cannot do everything that needs to be done to keep the Club functioning and moving forward. We are truly blessed to have so many people who are willing to give their time and expertise for the betterment of the club. I would like to list all of those individuals, but for fear of missing someone I would like to focus on the Club's 2003 Directors' Award, Volunteer of the Year, and the Volunteer Service Award winners.

The Directors' Award is voted on and chosen by the Club's Board of Directors and is given to the individual who has given unique and extended services to the Club during the past year. The 2003 Directors' Award posthumously goes to Mike Moulds. Mike's continued service to the Club went above and beyond the responsibilities of the office of the Treasurer. One of the additional projects that Mike and Dick Baker gladly took on this past year was the flight planning, logistical, and fiscal coordination for not one, but two, Club cross-country flights to Kitty Hawk to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of powered flight. Unfortunately due to weather, neither flight was able to launch. [One of my goals this year is to make sure the cross-country is successful for the Club]. Mike always provided BBQ burgers and dogs for whoever was at the Airpark, either impromptu or scheduled, again a service he gladly provided. [and an occasional can opener!] He

volunteered again this year to provide the planning and coordination, in union with Jim Frye, for the Annual Color Run. The Directors' Award will be presented in honor of Mike to Sandy at the Annual Christmas Party. The Volunteer of the Year is selected by the Club President and approved by the Board of Directors. The award is in recognition of continued volunteer service to the Club. The 2003 Volunteer of the Year award posthumously goes to Rich Pendergist. It is hard to list all of the different times and events that Rich volunteered to help the Club this year. He was always available to help any of the other officers of the club in the performance of their positions. His dedication to furthering the cause for ultralights and the upcoming Sport Pilot/Light Sport Aircraft went well beyond what was required by his position at USUA. If something involved the Club, USUA, flying, briefing, or instructing, Rich was there and involved. If he didn't have a family commitment, he was first in line to volunteer to help in any manner required for the Club. The Volunteer of the Year Award will be presented in honor of Rich to The Pendergist Family at the Annual Christmas Party.

Volunteer Service Recognition. Volunteer Service is defined as voluntary service to the Club over and above the responsibilities of a Club elected or appointed position. In the past, the Club has selected two members for this award. This year the Board of Directors changed the criteria from two awards to an "appropriate" number. The membership present at the November meeting selected this year's award winners. The Volunteer Service Award winners for 2003 are: Jody Clement, Jim Heidish, Jim Willess, Jim Frye, and Bob Van Veghel. The Volunteer Service awards will be presented at the Annual Christmas Party.

Congratulations to all award winners!! The Club is indebted to your service, commitment, and example.

ADVISORIES

November Meeting – Our meeting was in the Centreville Elementary School, our usual meeting place. Dave Riedel, our acting President, presided.

Visitor Ron Buzzard told us about his interests in flying and all the members present told him what we were flying and doing and where. We must have done a good job; by the end of the meeting he had become a member.

Bob Chapman introduced new member Harry Wright. He has a Challenger and is basing it at Whitman Strip. New member Ike Isenhour has a Flightstar and is also operating out of Whitmans. Welcome to all of you!

Secretary Lew Clement announced that memberships for 2004 were open: regular \$20, family \$25. Let Lew know if you need a nametag, new or replacement.

Larry Walker has agreed to be acting Treasurer and will do the job until someone who really wants to be Treasurer comes along or until the 2004 elections. He is gathering the information necessary. He will contact the bank and prepare the necessary signature cards to be able to write checks. He reports that we have about \$3070 in our treasury.

Dave told us that the Pendergist Family has asked that donations made to the Club in Rich's name be used for the Memorial Fly-in and the Rotax Tabernacle Choir. As of the 1st of November, the Club has received \$850.

Jim Frye's family has asked that money received in his name be put into the *Jim Frye Educational Fund*. Just how the fund will be used will be better defined in the days ahead.

The Board has selected Dick Baker to be Vice President until the next VP election in 2004. We thank Dick for stepping up and accepting the job.

The Board of Directors nominated for membership approval as Honorary Members for 2004 the past Honorary Members, the Lenn Brothers, Hara Bouganim, the Beatley Family and the Ford Family. They added Sandy Moulds, the Pendergist Family and Monica Frye. The membership approved all for Honorary Membership for 2004.

For the last two years, the Club has recognized volunteer service to the Club by its members at the Holiday Party. The Volunteer of the Year Award will be made to the Pendergist Family, recognizing the many volunteer services Rich provided to the Club while he was a member. The Volunteer Service Awards, as chosen by the members present at this meeting, will be made to: Jody Clement, Jim Frye, Jim Heidish, Bob Van Veghel, and Jim Willess. Monica Frye will be given a plaque recognizing the many services Jim performed for the Club. The others will receive Club caps with a gold star above the wings recognizing their service to the Club. We all thank these volunteers for their great help in making the Club a fun Club for every member.

Dick Baker, the Chairman of the Nominating Committee, announced that the election ballot had the names of Dave Riedel and Greg Palmer for President, Lew Clement for Secretary and space for write-ins for both positions on it. The election that followed chose Dave Riedel as President until 2005 and Lew Clement as Secretary for the same period.

Dave asked for a volunteer to honcho the Holiday Party at the Warrenton Air Park on Saturday, December 6. He asked everyone to bring a covered dish. A sign-up list will be on the web site to help everyone coordinate what he or she will bring. Greg Palmer volunteered to handle it. Thanks a lot, Greg! Let's everyone support him!

Larry Walker brought tools from Mike Mould's hangar that were for sale – several table tops full of bargains. A lot of them were sold during this evening.

Dave reminded us that we needed some new volunteers: a monthly events (at meetings) coordinator, fly-in coordinator and a Club tools manager. Larry has

the tools and Jim Willess has the Club parts collection. Jim also volunteered to handle the monthly program coordination.

Jody started a discussion of bringing the Club members' wives to meeting and into Club activities. They were reminded that our Club is one of the few in which the wives are not active, and even acting as Club officers. In one club, they are even taking flying lessons. Dave added that he would like us to have activities that would involve our children. Perhaps that would create an interest in aviation in them and, even, of being future Club members.

Dave reminded everyone present that we may find the most current information on the Club on the Club web site. He thanked Paul Dwyer for his indefatigable work in keeping it so current.

Dave briefly recapped the tragic events of the past few weeks (the deaths of Rich Pendergist, Mike Moulds in one plane accident and Jim Frye in a second.) and then turned the meeting over to Jim Willess who has completed his investigation of the first accident and is still involved in the second. He outlined the causes of the first crash as they have been determined. Phil Williams has been assisting him.

Larry Walker observed that these crashes are a rare event in the history of ultralight aircraft safety. We shouldn't allow our view of how safe these aircraft are to be distorted by these two crashes in close succession. Flying ultralights is still safer than driving according to national statistics.

All information concerning services for each has been placed on the web site. Additional information regarding contributions to be made in memory of each of the three is also available there.

The Club voted to contribute \$200 to the fire department that responded to Rich and Mike's crash. Another vote increased the amount given to the Rescue Squad in Leesburg from \$50 to \$100 in memory of Mike.

With the membership's approval, the Board will determine what should be done about sending a contribution to the Wardensville, WV, Fire Department. At Monica Frye's request, a Jim Frye Educational Fund has been established within our Club. More details on it will be announced at the December meeting and in the next newsletter.
