October Club Meeting - We met on a rainy Thursday evening, October 6th, back at the Centreville High School.

We introduced ourselves to the visitors or newcomers and they told us about their interests.

The Secretary reported only one more member this month, an old-timer, we has rejoined us: Brooke Pennypacker. We told the newer members and visitors about his adventures flying a trike, supporting the migrations of Canada geese and trumpeter swans.

Our Treasurer reported that, as of 10-06-05, our income for the month was \$37, our expenses were #458.99 and our balance was \$4847.30. Part of that expense, he reported, was the \$100 contribution the Club made to the Salvation Army in support of Katrina flood relief efforts.

We discussed the need for a trailer to recover ultralights. Tom Lodahl has a trailer at the Air Park that is being used to move heavy equipment around the field and could be used for recovery, as well. However, it would need state tags for that purpose. Larry Walker is going to check out the details of the requirement. The purpose of the trailer fund that is one of our assets is to purchase for the Club an appropriate-size trailer to take on the road in support of aircraft recovery.

President Dave discussed the Fall Fly-in scheduled for Saturday, October 8th and the forecast for the full week-end of rain. He also reminded us of the Whitman Strip event on Saturday, the 15th and the Club Color Run on Sunday, the 16th.

Because of the heavy rain that has been falling for several days and its impact on the flying field at WAP, we decided to hold a BBQ lunch but no fly-in on the scheduled date, the 8th. Following dates are all committed. At first, we were going to hold it in Larry Walker's hangar. He was going to move his plane out to make room for us. However, we decided there would be more room in the newest fabric hangar. The Club tent will be placed in front of it and used for the food service. Dave will be out at the field early to help set things up. Steve Beste,

the event coordinator, reminded everyone who would be attending not to forget the food that they had signed up to bring. The Club would provide the meat, rolls, condiments and drinks.

Dave reminded up that the annual election of officers would be at the November meeting. This year the elections would be for President and Secretary for two-year periods. He reminded us that, for those who could not be present at the meeting, proxy votes would be accepted from members. At this time, there is no known candidate for President. Lew Clement has indicated that he will run for Secretary. The newly-elected officers will take-over at the Holiday meeting/party.

On that subject, Dave pointed out that our Club no longer fits in the field Club house plus the fact that Tom Richards now lives there. He suggested that we probably should look for a hall in the Warrenton-Manassas area that we could hire for the evening. The discussion ended with Dave and Jim Birnbaum agreeing to search out what might be available. The expectation is that they could easily

find a place for the date, December 3, so early in the month.
