FROM THE LEFT SEAT Len Alt, President

I would like to bring to your attention a serious issue with the USUA as a national organization. It appears USAA as a national organization may be on the verge of collapse. This complex situation is described on the USAA web site, $\underline{www.usua.org}$. Here is the direct link (near the top of the page) $\underline{http://www.usua.org/HotNews/Archives/20080825/.}$

I recommend you read this document. I received a call from Don Wulfinghoff, President of USUA Club 4. Don asked me what our club thought about the current situation with the national chapter of USAA. He asked about four issues that I think we as a club, need to consider:

- 1. Do we intend to pay our dues?
- 2. Do we think USUA will, or should, survive?
- 3. What benefits does our club expect as a result of belonging to USUA?
- 4. What can USUA do to support ultralight flying?

I have communicated these concerns to our Board of Directors and now I would like to hear your thoughts regarding what action, if any, USUA Flying Club 1 should take, and what the national USUA organization should be doing for ultralight flying.

As an aside, Don and I talked about the state of ultralight clubs in the area. We discussed membership and activity. I told Don our club has around 57 paid up members, and I estimated we have around 43 who are active fliers. Don said that based on that Club 1 was probably one of the more active clubs in the area. I concur with that, and wanted to pass on to you an informal assessment Tom Richards compiled of the aircraft and flyers we have at Warrenton Air Park.
