R&D? Us? About the only research & development most of us do is to try to find a supplier for some obscure gizmo on our aircraft. And yet, it's in our by-laws: "Promote and encourage grass roots efforts relating to aviation research and

development." And to my surprise, the club is doing R&D. Read on...

DARPA parasail idea. A friend of mine is a defense contractor for DARPA, working as a program manager. DARPA is the Defense Department's skunk works for OSD and executes R&D on cutting edge-innovative technology about 10 years out. I brought him to the last club meeting, thinking he was interested in maybe taking up PPGs. But no. His interest was professional. He wanted to apply our PPG crew's experience to a DARPA idea. Some of his colleagues are working on technology problems associated with a parafoil's wind-penetrating capability. If they are successful, the increased capability would open up parafoils' utility, enabling missions that are not currently imaginable. For example, a parafoil might be part of an autonomous all-weather delivery system for troops on the side of a mountain that are cut off from logistics. So far, a company called Paradynamics has demonstrated 100 mph specialized wings and 50+ mph on standard wings such as the ones we fly. My friend was skeptical going into the meeting and even more so coming out of it as to a parafoil's utility due to handling at takeoff. Hearing Michael and Jeff talk about PPG takeoffs, my friend figured there might be a problem in getting a parasail kited up under the conditions DARPA has in mind. (Do you think?) He was grateful to talk with some guys who have hands-on experience with parasails. He left with a plan to put his colleague in touch with Michael for a little real-world reality check on this idea. Club 1 R&D at work!

Ultralight acoustic sensor. You'll remember that last year about this time, we were contacted by two companies that were bidding on a Homeland Security contract to sense ultralights bringing drugs over the Mexican border. Lloyd Peterson flew some patterns for them so they could test their sensors on a real ultralight (loosely defined). I then sent them to Ron Dixon, the trike instructor in Amherst, for some testing with trikes. More Club 1 R&D.

SFRA intrusion exercise. I just heard from a lady at MIT who's looking for three or four "ultralights" to fly some test incursions into the Washington SFRA next November as part of the military's regular tests of their detection abilities. (She promises that they won't shoot you down. But then, she says that she herself will be in Cambridge on the day, so you're on your own, Bucko.) The sponsor is DoD, via something called the Joint Integrated Air and Missile Defense Organization. Here's the plan:

- Three or four aircraft
- Trikes or something like a Phantom / Flightstar / Hurricane. Maybe Dick Martin's Allegro
- Tests will be going on during one week next November.
- You'll be asked to make a flight of half an hour to two hours out of Quantico around a course of GPS waypoints. Just regular flying. Nothing especially high or low or weird.
- Bear in mind that there aren't many places to land near Quantico. It's all woods, river, or subdivisions, so you would be flying over hazardous terrain.
- Each aircraft will probably make just one flight, different aircraft on different days.
- The lady seemed supremely confident that she could get the FAA to waive the usual SFRA transponder requirement.
- An aircraft radio would probably be required, though she might supply one.
- You could probably fly into Quantico the evening before and do the test flying early the next morning. Or vice-versa.

Interested in doing this bit of R&D? Let me know. She would like the names of likely pilots and some description of their aircraft by May 15th.
